Progression

The appetizer was good,
the meal was great
and the dessert blew me away.

Coordinate relationships

Alternative

You can get the meal for \$4.99
or buy just the sandwich for \$3.25.

Subordinate relationships—Restatement

Action-Manner

I ordered the pizza
by using the iPad app.

Subordinate relationships—Restatement

Comparison

This spaghetti is great,
just like Grandma used to make.

Subordinate relationships—Restatement

Negative-Positive

Please do not yell at the dinner table;
talk in a normal voice.

Idea-Explanation

Let's skip dinner tomorrow to pray.
We can fast together about this issue.

Subordinate relationships—Restatement

Question-Answer

Am I hungry?!

I am starving!

Subordinate relationships—Distinct Statement

Ground

We do not need to pay.
I have a gift certificate!

Subordinate relationships—Distinct Statement

Inference

You finished all your beans.
Therefore, you can have dessert.

Subordinate relationships—Distinct Statement

Bilateral

Do not start eating yet!
The food is still too hot.
Wait until it cools down.

Subordinate relationships—Distinct Statement

Action-Result

I ate too much.

I feel terrible!

Subordinate relationships—Distinct Statement

Action-Purpose

Can you bring me the check
so that I can pay?

Subordinate relationships—Distinct Statement

Conditional

If anyone wants more,
just ask.

Subordinate relationships—Distinct Statement

Temporal

Dinner is so much more pleasant
when we eat at 7pm.

Subordinate relationships—Distinct Statement

Locative

I love to eat out
wherever they serve burgers.

Subordinate relationships—Contrary Statement

Concessive

Yes, I ate everything on my plate,
but I did not like it.

Subordinate relationships—Contrary Statement

Situation-Response

That salad looks amazing
and you are not even touching it!
